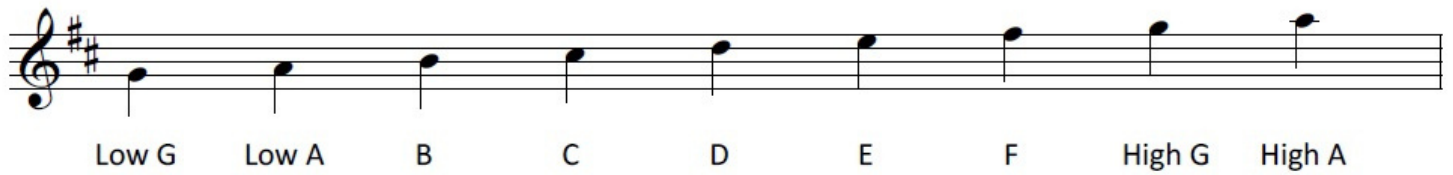


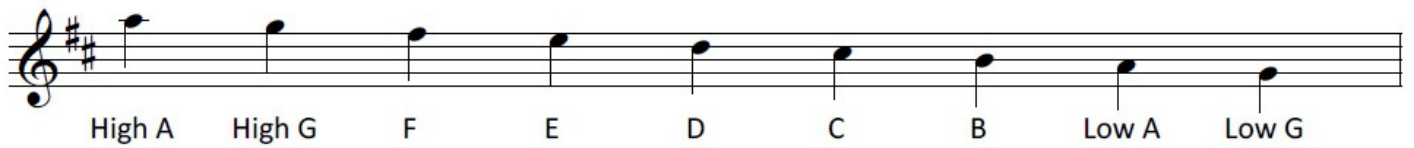

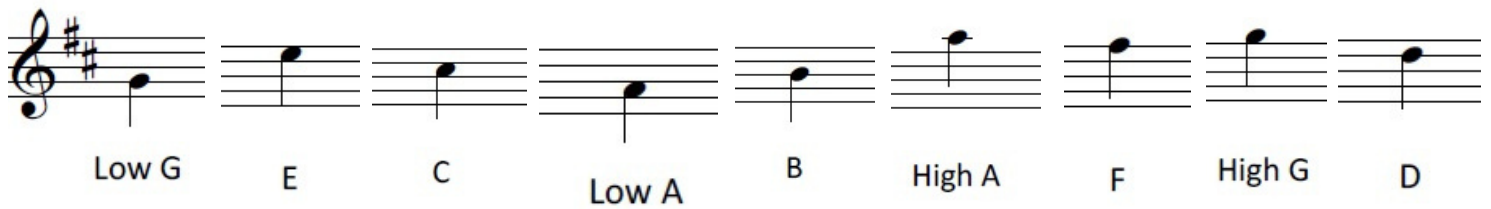
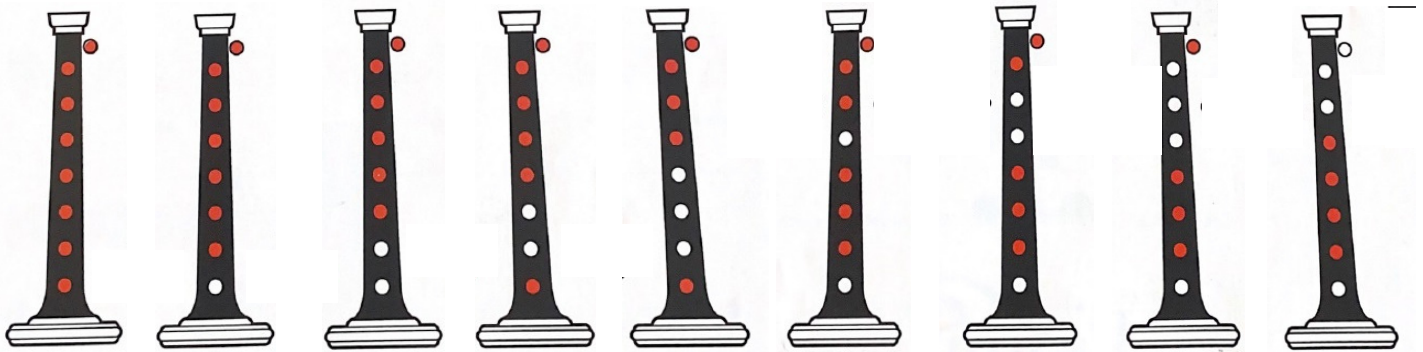

Join the chanters to the notes they represent
